WHY EARN A MASTER'S IN COUNSELING WITH A CONCENTRATION IN SCHOOL COUNSELING (SC) AT ULM?

- Predominantly online

The SC program is 60 credit hours and typically completed in two years. APPLICATION PROCESS

First submit an application to the ULM Graduate School along with transcripts and GRE scores. Once admitted, you may apply to the SC program. - Spring admission deadline is November 15th.
