Applicants who fail to meet the above standards may be admitted on conditional status as recommended by the Graduate History Admission and Curriculum Committee in concert with the Dean of the Graduate School. PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate requirements are 18 semester hours of social sciences and 18 semester hours of history. Basic core requirements for the Master of Arts in History are History 5030 and 5035. Additional requirements include 18 semester hours of history electives and six semester hours of History 5099 for a total of 30 semester hours. Students who do not wish to write a thesis are required to take 30 hours of history electives and the six hours of basic core requirements for a total of 36 semester hours for the degree.
