Undergraduate requirements include 9 semester hours of psychology, including at least 3 semester hours of statistics or its equivalent. The student will not be allowed to take more than 12 graduate hours until all undergraduate prerequisites are completed.

The Master of Science in Psychology offers specialized tracks in Psychometrics and General Psychology. Basic core requirements common to both tracks are PSYC 5009(3), 5022(4), 5023(3), 5034(3), 5052(3), 5061(3), and 5099(6). The Experimental track requires the addition of PSYC 5002(3), and eight hours of electives for a total of 36 hours. The additional required courses in the Psychometric track include PSYC 5011(3), 5015(3), 5018(3), and 5071(2) for a total of 36 hours.

Undergraduate requirements include 9 semester hours of psychology, including at least 3 semester hours of statistics or its equivalent. The student will not be allowed to take more than 12 graduate hours until all undergraduate prerequisites are completed.

Basic requirements common to all three tracks are PSYC 5022(4), PSYC 5023(3), and PSYC 5061(3). The General track requires the addition of PSYC 5002(3), PSYC 5029(6) and seventeen hours of electives (from specifically identified course groups) for a total of 36 hours. The additional required courses in the Psychometrics track include PSYC 5009(3), PSYC 5011(3), 5015(3), 5018(3), PSYC 5034(3), 5052(3), 5071(2), and 6 hours of psychology electives (from specifically identified course groups) for a total of 36 hours. The Criminal track requires the addition of PSYC 5009(3), PSYC 5018(3), CJUS 5001(3), CJUS 5005(3), CJUS 5040(3), CJUS 5055(3), CJUS 5076(3), and 5 hours of psychology electives (from specifically identified courses) for a total of 36 hours.
