# Note:

All music majors must pass all common courses and courses specific to their respective concentration, a total of 87 hours, with a grade of "C" or better.

Students enrolled in a Bachelor of Music degree with a concentration in instrumental music education or vocal music education are required to pass parts I and II of the Praxis examination as a prerequisite for student teaching. Students pursuing a concentration in Instrumental or Vocal Music Education should see specific requirements pertaining to teacher education and the Praxis exam in College of Arts, Education and Sciences section of this catalog.

To receive credit for performance courses, students are required to practice a minimum of four hours per week for each semester hour of credit carried; must perform before a faculty committee at each final examination period. Students completing their fourth semester in the major performance area must appear before the music faculty for examination purposes. Instrumental students must perform a "scale jury" in a semester decided by the studio teacher.

Students in concentrations that require credit hours in minor-level performance study must include 4 hours of piano if piano is not the student's major instrument.

Courses in performance may be repeated for credit; however, the student must complete the senior year requirements in one major performance area for a degree in music or music education.

Students registered in major performance courses are required to perform at least once during each academic year in student recitals. Those pursuing a performance concentration must present at least a half recital during the junior year and a full recital during the senior year.

Students enrolled in a Bachelor of Music Education degree with a concentration in instrumental music education or vocal music education are not required to enroll in a performance course during the semester in which they student teach.

Students majoring in music with a concentration in music theory and composition must complete by the end of the junior year a composition for their major instrument, a vocal composition, and a fugue. By the end of the senior year they must complete a movement of a sonata for chamber group and a composition for full orchestra or band. Scores and parts of a selected number of these compositions must be permanently filed with the department. Students pursuing this concentration whose major performance area is in voice or an instrument other than a keyboard instrument are required to take their 6 hours of minor performance studies in piano.

Prior to graduation, and preferably during the junior or senior year, each student majoring in Music with a concentration in Music Theatre must successfully perform a significant role in an ULM music theatre production. Students will enroll in <u>MUSC 4008</u> for three hours of credit during the semester in which they perform the role and obtain a final grade of no less than a "C" to meet this requirement. All candidates for degrees with a major in music, regardless of the curriculum followed, will be required to pass proficiency examinations in piano and must enroll in piano until the proficiency level appropriate to the major program is passed. Students whose major performance medium is other than keyboard must pass Piano Proficiency VI. Except for those students pursuing a concentration in Piano Pedagogy and those students pursuing a concentration in Instrumental Performance whose major performance area is in a keyboard instrument, the piano sequence <u>MUSC 1015</u>, <u>MUSC 1016</u>, <u>MUSC 2015</u>, <u>MUSC 2015</u>, <u>2016</u> must be completed before enrolling in private instruction. Permission for exceptions to this may be granted by the Coordinator of the Division of Music.

All music majors must participate in at least one of the major music organizations, band, orchestra, or chorus, on a full time basis, for credit or non-credit, during every fall and spring semester enrolled. Participation in a particular organization must be directly appropriate to the student's major performing medium. Membership in the various organizations shall be determined by the director concerned. Music majors must obtain a grade of no less than "C" in the course. Music majors with a concentration in music education are not required to perform in a major ensemble during the semester in which they student teach. Qualified non-music majors may participate in these organizations for credit or non-credit and must be approved by the respective director. Qualified students may enroll in more than one ensemble per semester. Students with a concentration in instrumental performance must enroll in four semesters of <u>MUSC 4034</u> (Chamber Music) for one credit in addition to the major ensemble requirements detailed above.

All music majors must enroll in Recital Class (<u>MUSC 1000/MUSC 2000/MUSC 3000/MUSC 4000</u>) each semester of attendance and obtain a grade of no less than "CR" in the course. Music majors with a concentration in music education are not required to enroll in Recital Class during the semester in which they student teach.

All music majors must pass all common courses and courses specific to their respective concentration, a total of 87 hours, with a grade of "C" or better.

Students enrolled in a Bachelor of Music degree with a concentration in instrumental music education or vocal music education are required to pass parts I and II of the Praxis examination as a prerequisite for student teaching. Students pursuing a concentration in Instrumental or Vocal Music Education should see specific requirements pertaining to teacher education and the Praxis exam in College of Arts, Education and Sciences section of this catalog.

To receive credit for performance courses, students are required to practice a minimum of four hours per week for each semester hour of credit carried; must perform before a faculty committee at each final examination period. Students completing their fourth semester in the major performance area must appear before the music faculty for examination purposes. Instrumental students must perform a "scale jury" in a semester decided by the studio teacher.

Students in concentrations that require credit hours in minor-level performance study must include 4 hours of piano if piano is not the student's major instrument.

Courses in performance may be repeated for credit; however, the student must complete the senior year requirements in one major performance area for a degree in music or music education.

Students registered in major performance courses are required to perform at least once during each academic year in student recitals. Those pursuing a performance concentration must present at least a half recital during the junior year and a full recital during the senior year.

Students enrolled in a Bachelor of Music Education degree with a concentration in instrumental music education or vocal music education are not required to enroll in a performance course during the semester in which they student teach.

Students majoring in music with a concentration in music theory and composition must complete by the end of the junior year a composition for their major instrument, a vocal composition, and a fugue. By the end of the senior year they must complete a movement of a sonata for chamber group and a composition for full orchestra or band. Scores and parts of a selected number of these compositions must be permanently filed with the department. Students pursuing this concentration whose major performance area is in voice or an instrument other than a keyboard instrument are required to take their 6 hours of minor performance studies in piano.

#### **Doctor of Occupational Therapy**

The Occupational Therapy Doctorate (OTD) Program is a 3.5-year program that includes two Level II fieldworks (a minimum of two twelve-week fieldwork rotations) in approved clinical settings coordinated by the OTD Academic Fieldwork Coordinator and a fourteen-week (minimum of 560 hours) doctoral capstone project under the direction of an approved mentor in an approved setting coordinated by the OTD Capstone Coordinator.

The entry-level occupational therapy doctoral degree program has applied for accreditation and has been granted Candidacy Status by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) of the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA), located at 4720 Montgomery Lane, Suite 200, Bethesda, MD 20814-3449. ACOTE's telephone number c/o AOTA is (301) 652-AOTA and its Web address is www.acoteonline.org. The program must have a preaccreditation review, complete an on-site evaluation, and be granted Accreditation Status before its graduates will be eligible to sit for the national certification examination for the occupational therapist administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapist, Registered (OTR). In addition, all states require licensure in order to practice; however, state licenses are usually based on the results of the NBCOT Certification Examination. Note that a felony conviction may affect a graduate's ability to sit for the NBCOT certification examination or attain state licensure.

#### ADMISSION TO THE PROFESSIONAL OTD PROGRAM

Applicants for admission to the OTD Program must complete the following minimum criteria by the end of the Spring semester that application is made: 1) have a baccalaureate degree in a field or major other than occupational therapy, from a regionally accredited college or university; 2) have a minimum overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale and no less than a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale for the last 60 hours; 3) complete all prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or better; and 4) be admitted to the ULM Graduate School per the ULM Graduate School admission policies.

Prerequisite courses include Human Anatomy with Lab and Human Physiology with Lab (or Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II with labs), Statistics, Human Growth & Development, Introduction to Psychology, Abnormal Psychology, and Introduction to Sociology or Introductory Anthropology.

Application requirements will be to the Occupational Therapy Department, located in Caldwell Hall 111, no later than March 1 by 12:00 noon. If March 1 falls on a weekend or holiday, the due date will be 12:00 noon on *the last school day prior to March 1*. LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Students must have official copies of their transcripts submitted to the ULM Graduate School by the application deadline date of March. Official transcripts of the current application semester must also be received by ULM Admissions Office by May 25 of the application year.

Applications will be reviewed by the Occupational Therapy Admissions Committee. Questions regarding out-of-state candidates may be directed to the OT office at 318-342-1610.

Students accepted into OTD are required to fulfill the immunization requirements of ULM Student Health Services. Once accepted into the OTD Program, the student has two academic years to successfully complete the didactic coursework of the program followed by six months of full-time level II fieldwork and fourteen weeks of doctoral level capstone project and experience. A student who fails to do so will be required to appear before The University of Louisiana Monroe Occupational Therapy Academic Performance Committee for a hearing to determine continuation in the program.

To progress in the OTD Program, a student must complete all required didactic occupational therapy courses with a grade of "C" or better and a cumulative 3.000 on a 4.000 scale, and the student must not earn more than 2 courses/6 credit hours with a grade of "C". The student must complete all courses in the sequence leading to an occupational therapy doctorate degree. All OTD professional program courses must be taken at ULM. Students who fail to successfully meet all requirements (due to not meeting competency or based on grade) will be dismissed from the program. Students may request to

appear before the Occupational Therapy Academic Performance Committee to determine continuation in the program. Before going on Level II Fieldwork affiliations, students must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 3.000 (uncorrected). The Occupational Therapy Academic Performance Committee has the right and responsibility to impose sanctions on a student who does not comply with ethical, professional behavior, or patient welfare guidelines of the program after following due process guidelines of the program. Sanctions can include dismissal from a course with a grade of "F" and may result in permanent dismissal from the program. The Occupational Therapy Academic Performance Committee will determine the re-application status of any student who does not successfully complete the program. In lieu of comprehensive final examinations, the OTD degree requires a passing score on the Fieldwork Performance Evaluation.

A student who does not receive at least a grade of "C" on any Level II Fieldwork placement or the OTD Capstone experience shall be dismissed from the program. A dismissal may be appealed before the Occupational Therapy Academic Performance Committee to determine if repeated or additional coursework could justify readmission. All cases before the Occupational Therapy Academic Performance Committee will be reviewed on an individual basis. Students must complete all Level II Fieldwork and Capstone requirements within 2 years following the completion of occupational therapy content courses.
