Discussion:

- 1. General Education not being taken till late in student's academic progression. The general education, mainly the "Undergraduate Core Curriculum", are being taken very late in student program of study. It was discussed by the council that the creation and enforcement of rules that would not allow students to progress till they have completed their general education requirement may negatively impact graduation rates. Therefore, more investigation needs to be done into whether the issues is students not taking the courses that they are advised to take or is it an issue of bottleneck course that students are withdrawing from or failing or are students being advised out of non-major course work.
- 2. The use of the word "Substitutes for" in the catalog does not mean the same thing from program to program. The council suggested discussing with program that use the term to identify or clarify the term "substitutes for".
- 3. The non-enforcement of the 18-hour limit on semester hours Council representatives from the Registrar's office stated that due to the need to deal with registration for both winter and spring semester classes at the same time Banner

requires that the course hours be set at 24 hours, and this cannot be changed under the currents system. The council discussed whether reports could be generated so that students taking excess credit could be identified before the semester has begun when changes you student schedules could be easily changed.

4. Communication of changes specifically approval and rejection of programs from the BOR

This is still an issue and further investigation is needed.

5. Building of the new curriculum forms New forms are planned to be built over the summer with coordination with Graduate Council that we expect to use the same forms.
