Implemented significant curriculum development around Common Core and Colorado's standards in language arts, math, science and social studies. Developed standardized common formative assessments building wide. Facilitated implementation of school wide Positive Behavior Intervention Support systems and further entrenched Restorative Justice practices within the school discipline philosophy. Additional emphasis placed on developing flexible scheduling encouraging re-teaching and enrichment opportunities for students not yet attaining growth. Moved Ortega Middle School from one of the lowest performing schools in the San Luis Valley of Southern Colorado to one of the highest. Other notable accomplishments:
