



Louisiana sits above the Gulf of Mexico at the mouth of the Mississippi River, bordered by Arkansas to the north, Mississippi to the east and Texas to the west. Originally colonized by the French during the 18th century, it became U.S. territory as part of the historic Louisiana Purchase in 1803 and was admitted to the Union in 1812. Louisiana's capital city is Baton Rouge. It is also home to the historic port city New Orleans, which is famous for its unique cuisine, jazz and spectacular Mardi Gras festival.

Joining a student group is a great way to get involved, meet new people, and share in common interests.





Any ULM student is eligible for part time on-campus employment. We offer student work opportunities in a variety of departments. Once an offer of employment has been made to an international student, the student can then apply for a Social Security number.



FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

OUT-OF-STATE FEE WAIVERS

Non-resident students must meet minimum requirements to be eligible for an Out-of-State Fee Waiver. Eligible students will be notified of the award after submission of their admissions application, official ACT or SAT scores, and official high school transcripts. The minimum requirements can vary from year to year; therefore, you should visit ulm.edu/international/scholarships to see the most current requirements. By applying for admissions, you are automatically considered for the Out-of-State Fee Waiver.

International Undergraduate Admission Requirements

- Completed a secondary program comparable to a U.S. high school graduation with a minimum 2.5 GPA
- Demonstrated an English proficiency (TOEFL=61 Internet=173 computer or 500 paper test, IELTS=5.5) or language of instruction in English
- Have minimum SAT scores of 450 (ACT score of 18) in English or SAT score of 460 (ACT score of 19) in Math
- Submit a Statement of Financial Backing accompanied by a funding letter or sponsor's bank statement.


HOW TO APPLY

The first step in the International Undergraduate Student application process is to apply for admission online at Apply Online (ulm.edu/enrollment/applyinginfo). If you haven't attended a university before, you will select application Number 5 for Undergraduate International Freshman. Applying early is best so that we can obtain and process your paperwork in a timely manner.

Once you have applied, you should mail the following to the International Student Office:

- Official transcripts from your high school and your School Leaving Certificate Examination scores.
- Official TOEFL or IELTS scores. ULM TOEFL code is 6482.
- A Statement of Financial Backing and Understanding with a bank statement showing funds to cover expenses on
- Official SAT or ACT scores. SAT school code is 6482. ACT school code
- A completed Immunization form.
- A copy of your current passport and visa if applicable
- \$30 application fee can be paid by money order or check drawn on a US





International Students that are granted admission to the Graduate School are eligible to apply for a Graduate Assistantship. Graduate assistants are appointed across a variety of academic and non-academic departments, and come in the form of teaching or research assignments. These appointments follow the university calendar and can be assigned during Fall semester, Spring semester, Summer I and Summer II terms, Maymester, and Winter intersessions. Additionally, students must be enrolled in graduate classes to be considered for graduate assistantships. The Graduate School considers assistantships to be a privilege; students given this opportunity will work to remain in accordance with the graduate school policies while maintaining excellent academic standing.

HOW TO APPLY

The first step is to apply for Graduate School admission online at **Apply Online** (www.ulm.edu/gradschool/international_admissions). You will select application number 4G for Graduate International. It is best to apply early, so your paperwork can be obtained in a timely manner.

Once you have applied, please send the following to the International Student Office:

- Official transcripts from any University you have attended. If you attended outside the US, we need an evaluation of the credits by World Education Services.
- A Statement of Financial Backing and Understanding with a bank statement showing funds to cover expenses on I-20.
- A completed Immunization form.
- Official IELTS or TOEFL scores. ULM TOEFL code is 6482
- GRE or GMAT (institutional code 6482)
- Three letters of recommendation.
- Statement of purpose.

- Graduate Assistantship
 Application, if applicable.
- A copy of your passport and visa, if applicable.





After all of your information has been received, it will be evaluated, and you will receive a request for any additional documents.

NEWLY ADMITTED STUDENTS

1. HOUSING

It is important to secure housing before your arrival. If you choose to live on campus, please complete the housing application at (ulm.edu/reslife/onlinehousingapplication). For more information visit: ulm.edu/reslife. Priority due date for housing application is mid-January. Any applications turned in after that date are not guaranteed housing.

2. AIRPORT TRAVEL

Reserve your plane tickets in advance. The airport code for Monroe is MLU. There are no nonstop flights to Monroe, so be prepared for at least one connecting flight. If you require airport pickup, please complete an arrival request and send to international@ulm.edu.

3. MONEY

For cost of attendance information please visit our website at ulm.edu/international. Your tuition and fees will be due no later than the Friday before classes begin. You will need a major credit card, electronic check or a bank draft. You also have the option to set up a payment plan which breaks your payment into 3 parts, each of which is payable about every 4 to 6 weeks. Carrying a large amount of cash is not recommended.

4. KEEP RECORDS

Be sure you are keeping up with records and copies of documents provided upon admission, such as, immunization, financial support documents.

Please make sure to complete ULM's immunization compliance form prior to entering the country. Located at ulm.edu/immunization.

5. LIEW FAMILY INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CENTER

The Liew Family International Student Center is a valuable resource to you on ULM's campus. For more information visit: ulm.edu/international/studentcenter. If you need temporary housing, the Liew International Family Student Center is available for temporary housing for a maximum of 10 days. 6. INTERNATIONAL STUDENT OFFICE

7. ORIENTATION

8. VISA APPOINTMENTS

If you require a new F-1 or J-1 visa to enter the country, please visit the U.S. Department of State's website at www.travel.state.gov (search for 'Student Visa') and follow the instructions for visa application. You will need your I-20 to make this appointment.
