In order to complete the Honors Core, Honors students must take Honors Freshman English, Honors Fine Arts, Honors Social Sciences, Honors University Seminar, and two courses in Honors Humanities (one of which must be Honors Literature).

Upon completion of the Honors Core, the student will have two choices:

- Honors in the College

To complete Honors in the College the student must take fifteen (15) hours of honors in the major\*, an Honors Colloquium, and an Honors Seminar. Successful completion of all requirements and a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.4 by the time of graduation will qualify the student to obtain a certificate and graduate from the Honors Program with Honors in the College.

To complete Honors in the University the student must take fifteen (15) hours of honors in the major\*, an Honors Colloquium, an Honors Seminar, and completion of the Honors Project (to include two credits of HONR 4015) to be completed during their junior or senior year. Successful completion of all requirements and a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.5 by the time of graduation will qualify the student to obtain a certificate and graduate from the Honors Program with Honors in the University.

\* Honors hours in the major must be completed using the Honors Option and must be approved by the Director of the Honors Program.

Successful completion of all requirements and a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.5 by the time of graduation will qualify the student to obtain a certificate and graduate from the Honors Program with Honors in the University.

Honors Contracts. The honors contract seeks to foster creativity and independence of scholarship as well as to develop relationships with the faculty members. Students can obtain honors credit by doing honors-level work in academic courses or cocurricular activities that include, but are not limited to, creative performance, service-learning, internships, travel abroad, and research engagement. The proposed contract must be approved by Director of the Honors Program.
