The Louisiana Board of Elementary Education's Bulletin 996: Standards for Approval of Teacher Preparation and/or Educational Leader Preparation Programs states that all Traditional Teacher Preparation Programs must have candidates complete a one-year residency in a public or approved non-public school classroom in the certification area with a teacher of record who holds a valid level 1, 2, 3, type A, or type B teaching certificate in the area for which the candidate is pursuing certification. For certification in B-K, PK-3, 1-5, or 1-5 integrated to merged, candidates must spend a minimum of 80 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week engaged in residency activities. For certification in K-12, 4-8, 6-12, 4-8 integrated to merged or 6- 12 integrated to merged, candidates must spend a minimum of 60 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week in the first semester and 80 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week in the second semester engaged in residency activities. Teacher preparation providers may seek approval to offer an innovative residency model that does not meet the minimum instructional time requirements but meets a specific workforce need and includes high-quality clinical experiences throughout the program and intensive clinical experiences throughout the residency year.

ULM undergraduate programs include modules in all pedagogy and methodology coursework that include strategies and interventions for students with special needs, including students who are limited English proficient.

#### b. Participate as a member of individualized education program teams, as defined in section 614(d)(1)(B) of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act*.

The courses that focus exclusively on special needs are SPED 2002 (Survey of Education of Children with Special Needs for Elementary) and CURR 3002 (Inclusive Instruction for Secondary). These courses familiarize students with characteristics of disabilities and accommodation strategies. Students learn about RTI and the referral/IEP process and the role(s) they will play in the process. Additionally, they complete ELED 3040 (Literacy in the Primary Grades) or READ 4019 (Reading for Secondary). These courses and instructors work collaboratively with our PDS to design field experiences in which students provide interventions to students and have opportunities to plan and implement tiered lessons for both special learners and LEP students. Throughout the program, candidates have opportunities to team teach and to teach individually, preparing them for interactions with special education inclusion teachers. During residency, students have the opportunity to participate with classroom teachers in all collaborative/consultative activities with parents, including IEP meetings and complete a course that includes identifying students with dyslexia characteristics and implementing interventions.

The teacher education programs at ULM offer multiple unique opportunities for the candidates. Each is assigned a personal adviser upon entry to the program and receive readily available assistance in navigating their program. Undergraduates begin their school-based experiences during their first years in the program and participate in increasingly responsible supervised teaching assignments throughout their coursework. The program uses a cohort model that is unique compared to programs at other institutions. Classes are small, promoting collaboration among students and providing accessibility to mentoring faculty. Principals have indicated that ULM completers walk into the classroom on their first day knowing how to teach. The foreign language teacher prepared in 2022-2023 completed the program in French. The music teachers prepared completed programs in instrumental and vocal music.
