As they offer critical counseling services to the community, students receive clinical supervision from **AAMFT-approved supervisors, gaining hands-on experience and supervised training as they prepare for careers in the field.

HOW TO APPLY

In an effort to maintain a family-style, cohort model, a limited number of students are admitted to the Marriage and Family Therapy Master of Arts Program. Students should apply before the **February 1 Priority Deadline.** Applications submitted after this deadline will be considered only if spots have not been filled.

Prospective students submit applications to ULM's Graduate School, and subsequently to the Marriage & Family Therapy Program. Upon acceptance into the Graduate School, the MFT Admissions Committee will review applications, and invite select individuals to participate in group and individual Interviews.

NOTE: Admission to ULM Graduate School does not guarantee admission into the Marriage and Family Therapy program.





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
