1. Apply to Graduate School as a student interested in majoring in Curriculum & Instruction (major code – CIME) <http://www.ulm.edu/gradschool/>. You must be a certified teacher to be accepted into the M.Ed. CIME program.
2. Contact Whitney Sutherland (sutherland@ulm.edu) to be assigned an advisor. Contact your advisor. Once advised, turn in your advisement record to Whitney (Strauss Hall 208) so your hold can be lifted.
