CELEBRATING OUR NEWEST PHARMACY ALUMNI



On Friday, May 16, eighty-six students participated in the College of Pharmacy Senior White Coat Ceremony, a special occasion where graduating students receive their long white coats, are awarded and recognized for their achievements, and are officially welcomed into the pharmacy profession by faculty, mentors, family and friends.

Here are some stats for the ULM PharmD Class of 2025: 31 graduates received Latin honors, having achieved GPAs exceeding 3.5 on a 4.0 scale. Out of those 31 students, 17 graduated cum laude with a 3.5 - 3.749 GPA; Twelve graduated magna cum laude with a 3.75 - 3.89 GPA; Two graduated summa cum laude with a 3.9 - 4.0 GPA; and 1 student graduated with a perfect, 4.0 GPA.

Sixteen graduates will also be pursuing postgraduate residencies or fellowships in medical centers and hospitals across the country including Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Nevada, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Texas.

Dr. Cain Doucet (PharmD '09) received the Non-Faculty Preceptor of the Year Award and Dr. Bryan Donald, ULM College of Pharmacy Associate Dean for Effectiveness and Strategy, received the Faculty Preceptor of the Year Award.





Dr. Below Receives Foundation Award for Excellence

The Foundation Award for Excellence in Creative and Innovative Works was awarded to Dr. Jameshia Below, an Assistant Professor in the School of Clinical Sciences in the College of Pharmacy. Dr. Below values the use of innovative teaching methods in her classroom, including employing the use of Al to craft realistic case activities, the use of an "escape room" to help students develop teamwork and solve complex diagnostic problems, the building of computer algorithms, and the use of a game show model. Dr. Below also received the Educational Innovation of the Year Faculty Award from the College of Pharmacy in January 2025.

ULM Welcomes New President



The University of Louisiana System Board of Supervisors has named Carrie Castille, Ph.D., the tenth president of The University of Louisiana Monroe. Castille is the first female president in the university's nearly 94-year history.

"I am incredibly honored and grateful to be named the tenth president of this incredible institution," said Castille. "I believe that great days are ahead for The University of Louisiana Monroe. I look forward to working hard alongside the faculty, staff, and community to provide the best education, experience, and opportunities for our students. Go Warhawks!"

Castille's appointment as president was made after the final round of interviews with the Board of Supervisors in Baton Rouge on Monday, May 19. Following her appointment, Castille reflected on her journey to becoming president. "It's been an incredible process and an incredible journey. Going through this process, you really learn a lot about yourself and your capabilities. You ask yourself if you can meet the expectations of the role. Then you say, 'I can do this' and make the decision and you commit to it," said Castille.

About Carrie Castille

Carrie Castille most recently served as an Agriculture and Natural Resources Consultant, providing strategic advice on agricultural policy and technical assistance at the national, state, and local levels. She has held significant roles such as Senior Vice-Chancellor and Senior Vice-President at the University of Tennessee, where she led agriculture research and extension programs, and Director of the USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture, overseeing over \$1.9 billion in funding for university partnerships. Additionally, she has held leadership positions in the USDA, where she contributed to policy development, crisis management, and economic recovery efforts.

Castille holds a Ph.D. in Renewable Natural Resources from Louisiana State University, with a focus on environmental and public policy. She also holds a Master of Science in Environmental Studies, with an emphasis on environmental policy and toxicology, and a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Engineering from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette.



Dr. Paul Sylvester to Retire



Dr. Paul Sylvester will retire from the College and School of Basic, Pharmaceutical and Toxicological Sciences (BPTS) effective June 30. He has served as a Professor in BPTS, the Director for Graduate Studies, and Associate Dean for Research during his tenure at ULM. He was recently given professor emeritus status at the 2025 ULM Foundation Awards for Excellence held on Friday, May 2.

Dr. Sylvester is an endocrinologist and his research interests have focused on endocrine-dependent diseases, particularly breast cancer. Dr. Sylvester's laboratory examines the mechanisms mediating the antiproliferative and apoptotic effects of tocotrienols, a rare natural form of vitamin E, in breast cancer cells.

Last Fall, he established the Paul W. Sylvester Louisiana Cancer Foundation (LCF) Endowed Scholarship. This scholarship was funded by private donations and with assistance from the Louisiana Cancer Foundation to support Dr. Sylvester's cancer research conducted in the ULM College of Pharmacy.
