**Learning Outcomes:** Upon successful completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Utilize matrices for solving systems of equations, applications of systems of equations, matrix addition and scalar multiplication, matrix multiplication, and matrix inversion.
- Solve general linear programming problems graphically and using the simplex method.
- Recall basic definitions related to logic, sets and set operations, cardinality, addition and multiplication principles, permutations and combinations.
- Understand probability concepts including sample spaces and events, relative frequency, modeling, counting techniques, conditional probability and independence, Bayes Theorem and applications, random variables and distributions, Bernoulli trials and binomial random variables, and normal distributions.

**Pre-Requisites:** Qualification through placement or a grade of C or better in MATH 111 or 115 Carolina Core: 3ARP.
